Butterflies class - 30 hours free nursery education Monday to Friday 9.00am - 3.00pm

Ladybirds class - 15 hours free nursery education Monday & Tuesday 8.45am - 3.00pm & Wednesday 8.45am - 11.15am
OR - Wednesday 12.30pm - 3.00pm & Thursday & Friday 8.45am - 3.00pm

Please contact school if you would like to add additional hours or days.

Would you like to top your 15 hours up to 30 hours?

OR Would you like to make your 2 ½ days, 3 or 4 full days by adding an additional Wednesday morning or afternoon or an additional day?

We can also provide wrap-around care from 7.45am till 6pm.

Nursery Admissions

Caterpillar Class 2 Year Old Offer

16 children can be admitted to our 2 year old provision in First Steps Family Wellbeing Centre in the term following their second birthday. This provision is in a purpose built room designed with both an indoor and outdoor space. Children admitted can receive 15 hours of free early education per week for up to 38 weeks of the year if they meet certain eligibility criteria. Allocation of a free place will be checked by Sefton.

Request for admission to our 2 year old provision as a free or paid place can to be made to Farnborough Road Infant School. Paid sessions are £15 per session. Admission to the 2 Year old provision will not guarantee a place in Reception in Farnborough Road Infant School.

Nursery Admissions

90 free nursery places are available for any child in the term following their third birthday in our spacious Nursery building. Application forms are available at the school office. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Admission to Farnborough Road Infants Nursery does not guarantee a place in Reception.

Parents are welcome to call into the Infant school office to put their child's name down for a Nursery place following their child's first birthday.

Infant School Admissions

By law, children become school age at the beginning of the term after their fifth birthday, but in practice, the great majority of children start school before that date.

At Farnborough Road we admit all of our pupils in September at the beginning of the new school year. These are pupils who will have their fifth birthday between the 1st September and 31st August that academic year.

Parents whose children are already in another school but wish them to make a move to Farnborough Road, for example, following a change of address should contact Sefton Admissions on 0151 934 3254 as well as the school.





The Infant School Day

The Main School begins at 8.45am and finishes at 3.15pm.

Doors open at 8.40am. The class teacher or teaching assistant will greet the pupils and parents at their allocated classroom door. Please be punctual. Children who arrive late for school miss vital learning time in their classroom.

Children in Years 1 and 2 will have a 15 minute break in the morning.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 will have 1 hour and 15 minutes for lunch and play time.

Reception will have lunch at 11.45am – 1.00pm, Year 1 and Year 2 at 12.00pm – 1.15pm.

If your child needs to be collected at lunchtime for an appointment please do so either before the start of the lunch break or at the end.



The Curriculum

At Farnborough Road Infant School we have adopted a whole school approach to planning and developing the Curriculum. We pride ourselves on providing rich, stimulating activities to ignite their creativity and imagination.

Early Years Foundation Stage (Nursery and Reception)

We follow the EYFS—Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum as the basis for planning our activities.

The three Prime Areas of Learning are Personal Social and Emotional Development, Communication and Language and Physical Development.

The four additional specific areas of learning are Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design.

The children are given opportunities to develop their skills and understanding through play and a balance of child initiated and adult directed activities. The outdoor learning environment is an important part of our provision and all children in the EYFS will spend part of each day exploring and learning outside.

Key Stage 1 (Infants - Years 1 & 2)

In Key Stage 1 we follow the National Curriculum as a basis for the activities that are planned in year groups. This is supplemented by our FRIS Curriculum offering many opportunities to develop our children's talents.

The National Curriculum comprises of :- English, Mathematics, Physical Education (PE), History, Geography, Art, Design and Technology, Music, Computing, Science, Religious Education (RE) and Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE).

After School

Parents should wait outside the classroom door or by the appropriate entrance for their child.

Very Important

Parents must inform the class teacher or school office if their child is to be collected by an adult other than themselves or another person known to the teacher. Children can not be collected by anyone under 16 years of age.

If you are unavoidably detained please inform the school office as soon as possible. Arrangements will then be made for your child. This will not necessarily be with the class teacher, as teachers have many professional duties and commitments after 3.15pm.

School Visits

The children undertake several educational visits during the year as part of their curriculum and topic work. Parents/Carers will be notified in advance and asked to sign a consent form, without which we cannot allow the children to participate.

The school will not be able to provide these valuable and stimulating activities without voluntary contributions towards the cost from parents.

Extra Curricular Activities

We place an emphasis on extra-curricular activities to enhance the curriculum for our children and provide them with access to a wide range of experiences in our after school or lunchtime clubs. For pupils in the infant school extra-curricular activities include, Art Club, Computer Club, Story Club, Lego Club, Football Club, Taekwondo, Judo, Dance, Cheerleading, Sing and Sign.

Children can collect Children's University credits for every school club they attend and those that they attend out of school too. Children who have collected enough credits will take part in Graduation ceremony at Edge Hill University in Year 2 and in Year 6.



Before and After School and Holiday Provision

A Breakfast Club, run by outside provider, Fun4Kidz is held in the morning, from 7.45am onwards, in our school canteen. Pupils need to book in advance. Breakfast is included in the child care cost. Contact Tel no 0151 932 9218.

An After School club, also run by Fun4Kidz, is also held on the school site until 6pm. Pupils are collected by the club staff at the end of the school day. A holiday club is also provided. Further details can be obtained by contacting the school's office.



Homework

In the Infants, as part of the home/school partnership, we expect parents to support their child's learning at home. Homework may include activities such as learning key words, spellings, times tables or mathematical or topic related activities. Reading book bags go home on a daily basis and children are expected to read at least 5 times a week.

Behaviour

At Farnborough Road Schools, we hope that our children will develop an awareness of self and a set of moral values. We aim to help them develop habits of self-discipline and acceptable behaviour as they move towards independence, self-esteem and self-motivation.

Our children follow four Golden Rules:

- To be kind and gentle
- To listen carefully
- To be honest
- To try our best

Parents as Partners

We acknowledge that parents are the child's first educators and aim to provide opportunities to enable parents to feel involved with their child's learning. These opportunities include Home visits, Pre-school visits, formal parents' evenings, Stay and Play / Stay and Share and Stay and Learn sessions and invitations to concerts and other special events. Parents receive a termly curriculum news which informs them of work and activities being covered in classes each term. You will be informed of your child's progress at regular intervals throughout the year. An initial parents' evening in October is followed by one in January and a further opportunity in July when you will receive your child's full report. You will also receive termly information about your child's progress in a Going for Green report.

Parents are always welcome. If you need to talk to the teacher, it will be most helpful if you could avoid detailed discussions at 8.40am when teachers are very busy with the children and the start of the day and talk to your child's class teacher after school. In the morning we have members of staff at the school doors to take any messages you may have for the class teacher.

A home-school agreement is issued to our

families when the children start school for parents and children to read and sign.

We are always looking for help in the classrooms or with listening to children read. Please contact the class teacher to discuss any support you can offer. All of our parent and grandparent helpers are cleared by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) before working with the pupils.

The Family Wellbeing Centre offers support and courses for parents throughout the school year.

Information for parents will be given through letters, the fortnightly newsletter and the school website www.farnboroughroadinfants.co.uk, the school APP and on Twitter @FrisInf.

The school has an active Parent Teacher Association (PTA) who organise many popular activities throughout the school year for the children and parents to enjoy. These include school discos, Mother's Day and Father's Day shops, Breakfast with Father Christmas, Christmas, Easter and Summer fairs. Everyone is invited to attend the meetings when events are proposed and organised. Together they raise valuable funds to enhance the learning experience of the children at our school.



School Uniform

Pupils in the Caterpillar class wear their own clothes whilst children in the Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 wear school uniform. All pupils will also need a Farnborough Road Infant School Book Bag and Water Bottle.

Autumn / Spring Uniform

- Gold polo shirt.
- Grey skirt or pinafore or grey trousers (or grey jogging bottoms- optional for Nursery only.)
- Maroon cardigan or sweatshirt with the Farnborough logo.
- Black school shoes.

Summer Uniform

- Red and white striped or checked dress.
- Short grey trousers.
- Black school shoes. We suggest shoes with simple fastenings e.g. Velcro fastenings for our younger pupils.

Please ensure that all clothing is labelled.

Uniform Shop

School uniform is available to order from our online shop using Parent Pay, please visit our website and follow the link from the parent's section. Uniform will be sent home via your child's class. For new families please allow 2 working days before collecting from the school office.

Uniform can also be purchased from the school office using cash or cheque, please fill in an order form available in the foyer and make cheques payable to 'FRIS'. During busy periods please allow 2 working days before collection from the office or delivery to your child's class.

P.E. Kit

- Black shorts and a white t-shirt.
- Black pumps.
- Farnborough Road PE bags.

Jewellery

Children should not wear any form of jewellery whilst at school (with the exception of plain studs to keep open pierced holes in ears). Stud earrings must be removed or covered by a plaster for all P.E. sessions. Watches may be worn entirely at parents' risk.

Hair

All girls and boys who have hair long enough to tie up should do so for health and safety reasons and to look smart and ready for school. Hair must be tied up for PE. Non regulation hair styles are not part of school uniform. These include: patterns cut into hair, hair that is long in parts and very short in others and hair that is a non-natural colour

Mobile Phones and other electrical equipment are not allowed in school.

Cycling to school

Children are welcome to come to school on bicycles or scooters. Permission is not required beforehand. In the interests of Health & Safety, pupils **must not** ride bicycles and scooters in the school grounds. Helmets **must** be worn and we advise the use of bicycle locks in our cycle stands.

PLEASE NOTE: Cycles are parked at school at the owner's risk. We cannot accept responsibility for lost or damaged cycles



Attendance

Good attendance is essential if your child is going to make expected progress at school.

Punctuality is equally important. Children who arrive late at school are unsettled and may have missed the first, vital part of a lesson. If you are unavoidably late you will need to sign your child in at the school office.

Sickness absence - Please telephone school in the morning if your child is unwell and going to be absent. Written confirmation of the reasons for their absence is also needed this can be provided in the form of an e-mail, absences.fris@schools.sefton.gov.uk or use the school App to provide a written explanation for an absence. If your child's attendance is causing concern we may request medical documentation in order to authorise absences for illness.

An e-mail in the morning to advise of an absence will act as notification and confirmation. Please e-mail absences.fris@schools.sefton.gov.uk or use the school App to report an absence.

All absences will be registered on your child's attendance record. These records are discussed with the Local Authority Education Welfare Officer and the school attendance officer on a regular basis.

Changes to the law in September 2013 gave parents no entitlement to take their child on holiday during term time.

If you require your child to take leave during term time a request form must be completed

(available from the school office) and sent into the Headteacher for approval. The law allows Headteachers to grant leave only in very exceptional circumstances.

Parents can be fined by the local authority for taking their children on holiday during term time without consent from school. The penalty is £60 per parent/carer, per child, if paid by day 21 and rises to £120 per parent/carer, per child, if paid between days 22-28. If the penalty is not paid within the timescale the Attendance and Welfare Service will institute legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court, under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, for failing to ensure your child attends school regularly. The matter will also be held on your child's school record.

Please avoid holidays and appointments in term time. Time away from school impacts on your child in many ways.



Inclusion / Special Educational Needs

Our aim is for every child to access a wide, broad and balanced and appropriate curriculum. To ensure this staff and Governors acknowledge the great importance of early identification of a child's learning/social difficulties.

We aim to involve and inform parents of any difficulties their child may be experiencing in school, to discuss the concerns and ways forward for their child.

Provision is in line with the SEND Code of Practice and may include targeted support in class or with a member of the intervention team, the class teacher writing a SEND support plan or support from Sefton's Special Educational Needs Inclusion Service (SENIS).

Before any of the above, parents are consulted and their permission is sought.

Safeguarding Children / Child Protection

Parents should be aware that the school will take any reasonable action to ensure the safety of its pupils. In cases where the school has reason to be concerned that a child may be subject to ill-treatment, neglect or other forms of abuse,

staff have no alternative but to follow Sefton's Safeguarding Children Procedures and inform Social Services of their concern.

Parents will usually be fully informed of concerns unless staff are concerned that the safety of the child will be prejudiced by their doing so.
