Policy on Admissions 2026-7

"Learning, Caring and Achieving Together"

How parents can apply for their child to be admitted to our school

Farnborough Road Infant School is a community school admitting children 2 to 7 years old.

2 Year Old Nursery

There are 20 part time places available in our 2-year-old provision / Caterpillar class.

The statutory ratio of staff to children for 2-year-old provision is 1:5.

Children can be admitted at the start of the term following their second birthday if there are places available.

Children entitled to the 2-Year-Old Offer will receive 15 hours of free early education per week for up to 38 weeks of the year if they meet certain eligibility criteria. A child may be eligible if a parent receives one or more of the following:

- Income support
- Income-based Jobseekers allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £15,400)
- Working Tax Credit and earn no more than £15,400 from work (correct in Jan 2024)
- Working Tax Credit run –on-paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working tax Credit
- Universal Credit

Allocation of a free 2-Year-Old offer place will be checked by Sefton's School Readiness Service.

From **September 2025**, eligible working parents with a child from 9 months old up to school age will be entitled to 30 hours of childcare a week.

Eligibility for free childcare entitlement includes:

1. Entitlement to free 15 or 30 hour 2 year old / 3 year old provision and is available to families where **both** parents are working (or the **sole** parent is working in a lone parent family), and each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum **equivalent to 16 hours at national minimum wage** (NMW) or national living wage (NLW), and **less than £100,000 per year**.
2. Working includes employed and self-employed persons. Parents do not necessarily need to actually work 16 hours a week, but rather their earnings must **reflect at least 16 hours of work** at NMW or NLW, which is **£107 a week** at the current NMW rate. This includes those parents on zero contract hours who meet the criteria.
3. Families where one parent does not work (or neither parents works) will usually not be eligible for these additional hours. However, the government has made provision to support families where one parent is in **receipt of benefits relating to caring responsibilities or a disability and the other parent is working**.
4. The additional entitlement is also available in the following circumstances:
 - both parents are employed but one or both parents is temporarily away from the workplace on parental, maternity or paternity leave;

- both parents are employed but one or both parents is temporarily away from the workplace on adoption leave;
- both parents are employed but one or both parents is temporarily away from the workplace on statutory sick pay;
- one parent is employed and one parent has substantial caring responsibilities based on specific benefits received for caring; or
- one parent is employed and one parent is disabled or incapacitated based on receipt of specific benefits e.g. period of ill health

We recognise that childcare is a major issue facing many working parents. At Farnborough Road Infants we want to support parents and their children at this stage in their life.

Parents are responsible for establishing whether they are eligible for the free 15 hour or 30 hours 2 year old or 3 year old childcare provision. Persons providing false or misleading statements made or provided in connection with a determination of a child's eligibility for the free entitlement and dishonest conduct in the process of making this determination may be imposed with a financial penalty of up to £3000 from the Secretary of State. (Childcare Bill: Policy Statement December 2015)

Request for admission to the 2-year-old nursery as a paid place can to be made directly to the school. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis at a cost of £22 per session or £50 for a full day including lunch.

Admission to Farnborough Road 2-year-old nursery does not guarantee a place in Reception at Farnborough Road Infant School but will give priority to Farnborough Road Infant Nursery Butterfly or Ladybird classes.

Any application to Nursery and Reception should be made using the criteria below.

3-Year-old Pre-School Nursery Provision

Request for admission to Farnborough Road Infant School Pre-School Nursery provision is made to the school directly. Up to 90 places will be allocated to children who are aged 3 years in the year or term before they start Nursery. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis (on responding to the school office provision email sent in the January before the September nursery start) unless children have previously attended the Caterpillar Class, in which case they will receive priority due to them already attending Farnborough Road Infant School.

The statutory ratio of staff to children for 3 year old provision with a class teacher is 1:13.

We offer the universal 3 and 4 year old entitlement of 15 hours per week free early education. We also offer an additional 15 hours of free childcare for children that are eligible for up to 30 hours 3 year old provision. (See above for the eligibility criteria)

Top Up Places

Parents who wish to extend their 15 hours entitlement and are not entitled to the 30 hour entitlement can pay for additional sessions. These will be charged at £22 per session and £6 for supervision over the lunchtime period. Parents requesting an extra full day will be charged £50 per day.

Admission to Farnborough Road Infant's Nursery does not guarantee a place in Reception. Applications for Reception places should be made through the Local Authority.

Farnborough Road Infant School

Admission to our school (Reception to Year 2) is determined by the admission arrangements in agreement with the local authority (LA). The Admissions Authority for our school is therefore the LA, which publishes its entry regulations every year. Parents can receive a copy of these regulations directly from the LA.

The LA's annual admissions information booklet informs parents how to apply for a place at the school of their choice. Parents have a right to express their preference, but this does not, in itself, guarantee a

place at that particular school. Application should be made online at www.sefton.gov.uk/admissions or on the form at the back of the admissions booklet. Applications should be made by the date stipulated. The Local Authority will notify parents of the decision as soon as all the applications have been considered.

In this area, children enter the main Infant school at the start of the academic year in which they become five. There is one admission date per year, early in September (i.e. when the autumn term begins). Therefore, parents who would like their child to be admitted to this school during the year their child is five should ensure that they return the necessary application form by the stated date in the year prior to admission.

Admission appeals

If parents wish to appeal against a decision to refuse entry, they can do so by applying to the LA. An independent panel considers all such appeals, and its decision is binding for all parties concerned.

The standard number

The published admission number or PAN number is the number of children the LA considers the school can accommodate. The standard admissions number for our school is 120, per year group. We keep this number under review, and the governors will apply to change the number if circumstances change.

Sizes of classes for infants

We teach infant children (aged five to seven) in classes that have a maximum number of 30 children.

Equality Act 2010

Under the Equality Act 2010 Farnborough Road Infant and Junior Schools have due regard to the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation.
- Advance equality of opportunity.
- Foster good relations.

Monitoring and review

This policy will be monitored by the governing body, who will always take due note of the guidance provided by the local Admissions Forum.

The policy will be reviewed regularly.
