A few reminders about our uniform:-

- * We expect children to wear plain black shoes and NOT trainers no laces unless the children can do them independently.
- * Pupils can wear a gold polo shirt with a burgundy cardigan/ sweatshirt
- Shirt and Tie and V neck jumpers are for the juniors ONLY.
- * Extremes of hairstyles will not be permitted e.g. tramlines, Mohicans, beaded hairstyles, decorative shavings— these are for holiday times only.
- * Long hair should always be tied back with school coloured/ neutral bobbles or bows. NO large, colourful bows are allowed.
- * Trousers/Shorts should be grey, NOT black
- * Children to wear PE kit for all PE lessons.
- * Earrings should not be worn for school, but where a child already has pierced ears, only small stud earrings are suitable. These earrings must be removed or covered with plasters (by the child) before he/she will be allowed to take part in any P.E. or Games lessons.
- * No other jewellery, apart from a watch, may be worn- No SMART watches please.

PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT ALL PROPERTY IS CLEARLY LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME/CLASS.

You could be entitled to £15 per child, per week shopping vouchers as well as a Winter Fuel Allowance if you receive any of the following benefits:

Income Support

Income based Jobseekers Allowance

Child Tax Credit ONLY (not entitled/receiving Working Tax Credit) and have an income of less than £16190.00

Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit

Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Universal Credit and have a net household income of less than £7400 per annum Support under VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act

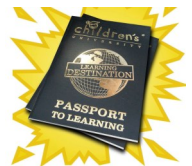

Thanks to this wonderful, dedicated team of parents we were able to pave the way for the contribute to the redevelopment of the school Nature Area, a shed for Nursery and purchase £5,000 worth of non-fiction books for our wonderful library. Please continue to support these events and our team in any way you can.



Attendance at school is statutory except in very exceptional circumstances. It is clear that academic achievement and excellent attendance and punctuality go hand in hand. We expect all children to aim for 100% attendance throughout the academic year, however we also understand that young children do get ill, particularly when they first start school, and do not expect children to attend if they are poorly.

We celebrate attendance each week in assembly with the best class attendance receiving the Attendance Bear and a certificate. Individual children who have 100% attendance each term also receive a praise certificate and our children who have 100% for the full year receive their own attendance bear key ring. Our current whole school attendance is 97%. Help us to keep it this high. Good attendance is considered to be 96% and above, any less than this will have a detrimental affect on their learning. Punctuality is also equally important.

This table illustrates the impact of attendance that is 95% or below

Attendance during one school year	Equals this number of days absent	Which is approximately this many weeks absent	Which means this number of lessons missed
95%	9.5 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	150 lessons
80%	38days	8 weeks	200 lessons

If a child's attendance falls below 95% then you will be contacted to work together to improve attendance.

If a child's attendance falls below 90% then this is seen as a persistent absenteeism and a support plan will be put in place to track and improve attendance.
